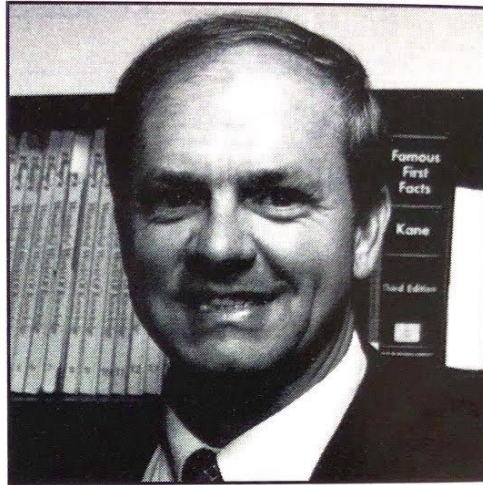


Outstanding Alumni: Mr. Eddie Jefferson Angel '70

The recipient of the Distinguished Alumnus Award was Eddie Jefferson Angel. A member of the Anniston Academy Class of 1970, he graduated from the US Naval Academy in 1974 and from Naval postgraduate school in 1985. He has flown anti-submarine patrol planes, has been a tactical coordinator, has served
