## Outstanding Alumni: Dr. Beth Gibbins White, '88

Dr. Beth Gibbins White, DVM, is a Board Certified Veterinary Ophthalmologist and a diplomat of the American College of Veterinary Ophthalmologist (ACVO). Dr. Gibbins is the daughter of Dr. and Mrs. George Gibbins of Anniston.

Ophthalmology has always been a part of her life since her father and grandfather were M.D. ophthalmologists. She received her B.S. in Biology from Davidson College in Davidson, North Carolina in 1992 and her Doctorate of Veterinary Medicine from Auburn University in 1996. Following graduation, she practiced general small animal veterinary medicine for four years in North Carolina and in Montgomery, Alabama. It was during these years in general practice that her passion for veterinary ophthalmology developed. In 2000, she returned to Auburn University and completed a one year veterinary ophthalmology internship followed by a three year veterinary ophthalmology residency. In 2004, she founded the Animal Eye Center in Birmingham, Alabama and in 2005 she started a satelite office in Huntsville, Alabama, being the first veterinary specialist to work in Huntsville. Originally ophthalmic consultations were available every three weeks in Huntsville. However, due to the enormous growth in Huntsville and the surrounding areas, these visits quickly shortened to twice a month and then weekly.

Seeing that this area greatly needed a veterinary ophthalmologist, she moved her family and relocated her practice exclusively to Huntsville. Dr. Gibbins and her family are very excited about living and working in the rocket city. Her favorite part of being a veterinary ophthalmologist is being able to help an animal restore their sight from cataracts or other potentially blinding diseases and she will tell you, "It never get old watching a patient wake up from cataract surgery and being able to witness them seeing again. And when the pet's family tells me how much they love watching their dog or cat looking out the window, chasing squirrels or being able to find their treats again, it's the icing on the cake!" Dr. Gibbins is also a member of the American Veterinary Medical Association, the Alabama Veterinary Medical Association, and the Madison County Veterinary Medical Association. When not practicing ophthalmology, she enjoys reading, traveling, and spending time with her husband, four sons, and two rescue dogs, Rocket and Skye (who were named many years before moving to Huntsville).
